John shared a document with the committee about catalog rights on retroactive awards. The idea is that if a student took classes, but never applied for graduation. Then come back several years later, we would award them that degree. This document was a first read.

The Guided Pathways office returned to the curriculum committee to discuss the topic of adding pre-requisites to their program maps in order to provide transparency for students. After doing some research they realized that most colleges are mapping their requisites. They are mapping and talking about their requisites in their catalog as part of the overall guided pathways and student equity initiative that are at the state related to student transparency. Matt Taylor did a presentation on requisites and why program mapper should include them. He provided examples of what the map will look like with the pre-requisites and without.
