- A. Campus Collaborations Team: March 7 edit:-March 6
 It will be a daylong seminar, various stakeholders will be meeting at the Anaheim campus and discussing strategies and plans to increase enrollment. On Tuesday, March 7, Fullerton College formed a campus-wide Campus Collaborations Team, and met for the first time on that day.

It is too late to add courses to the March DCCC agenda. There is a meeting in April, however. Proposals that must go to UC/TCA June 1st need to be curriculum committee approved next meeting March 15th so the Articulation officer, VPI and President have time to approve. Matt also mentioned Guided Pathways is leading in terms of OER. Matt brought it to faculty senate and asked for their input on a creation of quality control or some sort of oversight to make sure OERs that are offered as textbooks meet the copyright and accessibility guidelines. Library's Jane Ishibashi is helping Guided Pathways lead the ZTC workgroup; everyone is invited.

Guy wanted to remind everyone to start participating in technical review. Proposals sit in technical review for 2 weeks. If any issues or concerns let Guy know.

IX. <u>Credit for Prior Learning</u>: (Scott Lee, Articulation, and Ken Starkman, Technology and Engineering) Nick Arman will be attending the curriculum committee on March 29th to talk about military credits. The CPL draft document was shared with the committee and reviewed. Jose Ramon recommends forming a committee to evaluate the requests instead of an individual person and a process for appeals. It is mentioned to involve faculty senate in the discussion. John, Scott, George, and Ken will work together with the document, then move to faculty senate to come up with specific approaches.
