Guy reminded the committee to pay close attention to tech review duties.

## X. <u>Ethnic Studies</u> (Ziza Delgado, Ethnic Studies Chair)

Delgado, the chair of the Ethnic Studies department, encouraged the Curriculum Committee to implement the AA GE revision in Fall 2024, and not to exercise the Fall 2025 "grace period" option provided by the state chancellor's office. Delgado reminded the committee that Fullerton College Ethnic Studies is celebrating its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the department has a well-established curriculum and reputation for success. During this presentation, Social Sciences curriculum rep Kelly Nelson-Wright stated that she wanted to change her support from "Title 5 + 3" to "Title 5 only," after a careful discussion involving her division. John asked that Kelly's discussion be continued later, during the "AA GE" discussion item.

Discussion continued. There remained many questions about procedure, workflow, and implementation of CPL. The VPI reminded us that we had time to develop a more thorough plan. There was no vote.

  - C. Discussion of "Title 5 + 3" John began the April 17, 2024, discussion by reminding the committee that, at this meeting, we would decide what the "+3" would involve. He explained that we faced time constraints; he had learned that Faculty Senate expected an update from the committee, and hoped for an AA GE recommendation, at the 4/18/24 meeting. Some reps wanted to have a new vote from the 04/03/24 vote, choosing between "Title 5 + 3" and "Title 5 only." Jeanette Rodriguez reminded us that we would need to finish the "Title 5 +3" discussion that John started if we wanted to raise another topic. The "Title 5+3" discussion ensued. Thydan defended Lifelong Learning in detail. To illustrate a scenario involving added local requirements, John showed a document featuring the 7 courses in 6 areas mandated by Title 5, along with a Lifelong Learning GE requirement (as Area 7) plus 2 graduation requirements: PE and Multicultural Education (MCE). Kelly reminded us that she had announced she changed her vote to "Title 5 only" during the 4/17/24 "Ethnic Studies" discussion item a little while earlier. She did not want to continue discussion of this document, since she supported the removal of MCE. These are the events that led to the Social Sciences division's choice to support "Title 5 only." Between the 4/3 and 4/17 meetings, Kelly had met with 11 departments in her division, and there was a lengthy discussion in which they realized there were complications in having both an Ethnic Studies GE requirement and a Multicultural graduation requirement. For one thing, satisfaction of Area 6 (Ethnic Studies) automatically meant satisfaction of MCE, due to allowance for double counting between one GE area and one graduation requirement. Despite this challenge, Social Sciences did not want to divide Ethnic Studies and Multicultural Education into two separate GE areas. Moreover, the division heard the concerns of the Ethnic Studies faculty who had started to worry that the AA GE revision would not be implemented until Fall 2025. The department had many reasons to implement the Ethnic Studies requirement in Fall 2024 and had argued for a 2024 implementation. Based on this knowledge, the Social Sciences division decided to reverse its earlier support for "Title 5+3." Instead, it would support "Title 5 Only." The committee voted not to continue the debate. By roll-call vote, 7 reps voted no to "Title 5+3," and 3 reps voted yes.

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After that, Allen proposed a new motion, which Guy seconded: "Title 5 + EITHER Foreign Language OR Multicultural as grad requirements, double counted with GE areas." Discussion on this item was brief, and several reps expressed lack of interest in pursuing this option via formal vote.

A motion to "close the debate" was proposed. By roll-call vote, 9 voted to close this debate, and 1 voted not to close this debate.

After the debate closed, John asked for motions. Gary made a motion to approve "Title 5 only." Kelly seconded the motion. This discussion lasted for over 10 minutes. Yolanda and Thydan wanted an alternative to "Title 5 only," and they provided detailed reasons why the addition of Lifelong Learning and PE activity courses would contribute to student success. Gary, Kelly and Toni affirmed support of "Title 5 only" in their own, detailed responses. A motion was made to close the debate.

Roll-call vote: 6-4 in favor of a Fall 2024 implementation of Ethnic Studies in the AA GE. However, John announced, by mistake, that the vote on this motion was for Fall implementation applied to the entire AA GE option of "Title 5 only," even though Guy's motion focused on committee approval of a Fall implementation of Ethnic Studies.
